APPLICATION

Applicants for admission into the program must:

Hold a bachelor's degree prior to the application deadline. Preference given to applicants with a grade point average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale.

Applicants must complete a Stony Brook University School of Health Technology and Management application and submit official transcripts of all college work. We now offer a distance learning option.

Submit application by November 1 for spring matriculation, by May 1 for fall matriculation.

When your application and all supporting documents are received, your file will be reviewed by our admissions committee.

Incomplete files will not be reviewed.

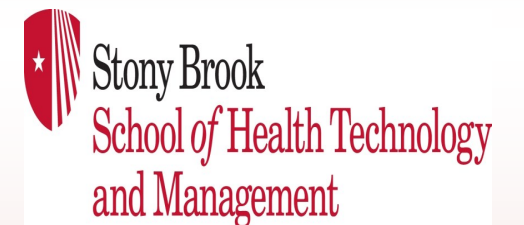

Advanced Certificate Program in Health Care Management

The Advanced Certificate in Health Care Management (ACHCM) is designed to provide knowledge and skills needed to address the health care needs and managerial demands of health care today. This program explores health care as it relates to diverse populations in a variety of health care settings, including hospitals, long-term care facilities, private practices, health agencies, not-for-profit organizations, county health departments, commercial laboratories, and ambulatory care centers. This program is especially well suited for those with a Bachelor's degree who are seeking to develop a management background to enhance their existing health care careers or to those with managerial experience who desire knowledge and training in the health care fields. Courses are offered in the late afternoon/early evening or on-line. Certificate program students are required to complete the program over a three-year period. Students must matriculate at least two semesters before they graduate.

- Designed to meet the needs of both the full-time graduate student and the working professional
- Intended for health care practitioners who require management training
- Intended for managers who require specific management training in the health care field
- Admission requirements: Prior to applying, applicants must have completed a BA or BS degree with a GPA of 3.0 or better [on a 4.0 scale]
- 18-credit curriculum
- Part-time and full-time options

The University

Stony Brook University was established as New York State's comprehensive center for research and graduate study in the metropolitan downstate area. Today, the campus has grown to 1,600 acres with more than 200 buildings and over 24,000 students, about 8,000 of whom are graduate students.

Admission to the MBA degree program requires an overall grade point average of at least 3.0; the Graduate Management Aptitude Test (GMAT) is also required for admission.
